## News from HPH Networks, Task Forces and Members

### HPH Task Force

#### News from HPH Task Force on Implementing and Monitoring Standards, ESP (Manel Santinà)

On behalf of Task Force leader Dr. Manel Santinà, the International HPH Secretariat sent an official call for participation in the Task Force on Implementation and Monitoring of Standards. As many HPH experts as possible should participate in the further work regarding implementing and monitoring HPH standards.

**Now, the update of the new standards is in its final stage.** The manual was revised on the basis of the results of an expert hearing. Six experts nominated by the WHO as well as 15 HPH coordinators (regional and national HPH coordinators, coordinators of hospitals) participated in the hearing.

As a next step, the Task Force will focus on the implementation of these standards. The implementation process is expected to last three years. In order to support the implementation, tools (e.g. videos) that guide hospitals how to implement these standards in practice will be developed.

Afterwards, the standards can be implemented in every health care center of each network.

### HPH Task Force

#### News from HPH Task Force on Health Promotion for Children & Adolescents in & by Hospitals, ITA (Ilaria Simonelli)

According to the philosophy of the Health Promoting Hospitals movement and its most recent orientations and experiences, the HPH-CA Task Force aims at applying HPH principles and criteria to the specific issues of children and adolescents, providing an organic conceptual and operational framework.

During the past year, the Task Force finalized a set of standards and indicators on health promotion for children and adolescents in hospitals and health care services. Children and adolescents have different needs regarding health promotion than adults. The standards and indicators are based on the concepts, guidelines and outcomes of the WHO Standards for Health Promotion in Hospital and on the Child Rights-based Approach developed by the UN Agencies (WHO, Unicef, Unesco). The standards and indicators are divided into 5 areas: management policy, patient assessment, patient information, healthy workplace, continuity and cooperation. They are also accompanied by an evaluation sheet in order to allow hospitals

and health services to measure their compliance level.

As a next step, the standards and tools will be tested. Thus, Ilaria Simonelli kindly invites all hospitals and health care services to participate in the testing phase. If you are interested, **please contact the coordinator via [ilariasimonelli79@gmail.com](mailto:ilariasimonelli79@gmail.com).**

### WG HPH & HLO

#### News from working group HPH and Health Literate Health Care Organizations (HPH & HLO), AT (Jürgen Pelikan)

A second very constructive online-meeting of the working group HPH & HLO took place on September 13, 2017. Nine participants of the working group from all around the world took part. We discussed the standards and sub-standards of the Self-assessment Tool following the "Vienna Concept of a Health Literate Health Care Organization" (V-HLO). The discussion was primarily based on two questions: (1) In how far are the standards/ sub-standards adequate and agreeable for your national/ institutional situation? (2) Do you suggest any necessary changes?

It was a fruitful, valuable discussion that showed hindrances that might occur, when the partners try to translate and adapt the tool for their home countries.

As a next step, we will edit an international version of the core tool suitable for use in different health care systems based on the suggestions and feedback of the working group members.

HPH and HPH partners

We would like to raise your awareness to a chapter in a recently published book, which deals with the performance evaluation of Health Promoting Health and Social Services Centres (HPHSSC) in Quebec (CA):

Dedobbeleer N. (2017). La performance et le concept "Centre de santé et de services sociaux promoteur de santé" (chapitre 3), in: **Améliorer la performance des systèmes de santé-Concepts, méthodes et pratiques**, sous la direction de Suarez-Herrera JC, Contandriopoulos AP, Cupertino de Barros FP, Hartz ZMA, Les Presses de l'Université de Montréal.

In chapter 3, Nicole Dedobbeleer examines how EGIPSS, a comprehensive and integrated performance assessment framework for health systems, could be useful in the performance evaluation of Health Promoting Health and Social Services Centres (HPHSSC), in Quebec. The WHO concept of Health Promoting Hospital was adopted by many Health and Social Services Centres (CSSS) after an important structural reform of the Quebec Health and Social Services System in 2003. It was seen as an integrated and compatible concept with practices and needs, and as a stimulating and winning approach that favored shared responsibility and participation of all actors involved. With Bill 10 in April 2015, the CSSS are further transformed into organizations with multiple vocations but also extended and highly differentiated vocations: the Integrated Health and Social Services Centres (CISSS) and the Integrated University Health and Social Services Centres (CUISSS). This most extensive reorganization leads to fierce criticisms among the key actors involved and raises deep concerns, particularly about the performance of the new centres. The examination of the performance of the HPHSSC as well as of its measurement seems thus pertinent in the current debate on the performance of the CISSS and the CUISSS but also in the discussion of the performance of all other health promoting health care organizations.
